The regular meeting of the Wellsville City Council was held on Wednesday, September 9, 2009 at 7:00 p.m. in the Wellsville City Hall meeting room, 411 Main Street. Councilmen present were Jared Eggleston, Ryan Young, Dave Rogers, Ron Samsel and Jim Stonequist. City Attorney Patrick Reavey was also present.

The pledge of allegiance and invocation were given.

Mayor Lytle called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

Councilman Jared Eggleston moved to approve the consent agenda as submitted. Councilman Ryan Young seconded. Motion passed 5 to 0.

Mayor Lytle opened the meeting up for public comments that had not been previously placed on the agenda.

There were no public comments.

Franklin County Commissioner Don Stottlemire informed Council that the County had received the City's letter regarding the use of the County's salt barn. The County is working on a policy.

Due to the Council not having a meeting again until the 30th, they briefly discussed Wellsville Day's.

Supt. Cross gave an activity report for the city's public works department.

Supt. Cross requested permission to purchase a small Bosch electric jackhammer. The cost of the Bosch electric jack hammer would be \$1200.00.

Due to the Chief of Police needing to leave, further discussion of the jackhammer was tabled until Chief Gillespie could give a police department activity report.

Chief Gillespie gave the police department activity report.

Councilman Jim Stonequist moved to purchase the \$1200.00 Bosch electric jackhammer, the expenditure is to come out the street department budget. Councilman Ron Samsel seconded. Motion passed. 5 to 0.

Supt. Cross informed Council that the supplies for this year's waterline project have been purchased and the project will begin as soon as the weather gets better.

The City's current policies green spaces that are located in some of the city's subdivisions were discussed.

Fire Chief Robert Thomas was absent and Asst Fire Chief Chris Bell was present in his place.

Asst Chief Chris Bell gave a fire department activity report.

Councilman Dave Rogers moved to recess the meeting until 7:00 p.m. Councilman Jim Stonequist seconded. Motion passed 5 to 0.

The meeting recessed at 6:35 p.m.

The Mayor called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Mayor Lytle opened sealed bids on the city's dump site clean up project. The bids were as follows:

Old School Trucking - \$22,500.00

Larry Baer Trucking - \$12,500.00

Meadows Construction Company - \$40,215.00

Criqui Construction Company - \$19,950.00

Matador Construction Company - \$15,400.00

Councilman Ron Samsel moved to approve the lowest bid \$12,500 from Larry Baer Excavating, contingent upon the acceptable review of all bid documents. Councilman Jim Stonequist seconded. Motion passed 5 to 0.

Councilman Jim Stonequist moved to adjourn. Councilman Jared Eggleston seconded. Motion passed 5 to 0.

The meeting adjourned at 7:11 p.m.
