The regular meeting of the Wellsville City Council was held on Wednesday, April 28, 2010 at 6:00p.m. at the City Hall meeting room, 411 Main Street. Councilmen present were Jared Eggleston, Ryan Young, David Rogers, Ron Samsel and Jim Stonequist. Department heads present were Supt. Christopher Cross and Fire Chief Robert Thomas.

Mayor Lytle called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

The pledge of allegiance and invocation were given.

Councilman Ryan Young moved to approve the consent agenda as submitted. Councilman Jared Eggleston seconded. Motion passed 5 to 0.

Mayor opened the meeting up for public comments that had not been previously placed on the agenda.

There were no additional comments from the public.

Fr. Co. Commissioner Don Stottlemire provided Council with a list 2009 & 2010 tonnage figures from the County wide clean-up. Wellsville's figures were 39.23 tons in 2009 and 23.95 tons in 2010.

Commissioner Stottlemire informed Council that the County is still working very hard on keeping expenses down. Salt and sand bids were received and came in under 2009 costs.

The Franklin County Republican party will meet Monday to vote on a recommendation on who will fill Sheriff Craig Davis' position due to his resignation.

Councilman Jared Eggleston moved to keep the 2009 council committee assignments in place for 2010. Councilman Ron Samsel seconded. Motion passed 5 to 0.

Councilman Ron Samsel moved to approve the Mayor's Zoning Appeals board appointments. Councilman Jared Eggleston seconded. Motion passed 5 to 0.

Councilman Ryan Young moved to approve the Mayor's Library board appointments. Councilman Ron Samsel seconded. Motion passed 5 to 0.

Councilman Jim Stonequist moved to approve the Mayor's Planning Commission board appointments. Councilman Dave Rogers seconded. Motion passed 5 to 0.

Councilman Ron Samsel moved to nominate Jared Eggleston as this year's Council president. Councilman Ryan Young seconded. Motion passed 4 to 0. Councilman Eggleston abstained.

Resolution 04-428-2010 “A Resolution adopting the Franklin County Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation plan” was submitted for approval.

Councilman Jim Stonequist moved to adopt Resolution 04-428-2010. Councilman Ron Samsel seconded. Motion passed 5 to 0.

Supt. Cross gave a public works activity report.

Councilman Ryan Young asked Supt. Cross where the City was on the water & sewer studies.

Supt. Cross reported that the Engineer’s are completing the study reports. He stated that staff will need to hold some internal meetings before a recommendation can be submitted to Council.

Councilman Young asked if grant funding had been found for the replacement of the city’s sirens.

Councilman Jared Eggleston is currently working on a grant source for new sirens.

Supt. Cross informed Council that he had talked to Patchen Electric and the repairs on the water tower siren should be completed sometime this week.

Building Inspector/Code Enforcement Officer Wes Brown was present to discuss some zoning violations that are occurring within the City regarding driveways.

Mr. Brown asked Council for some guidance on how they would like his department to handle the violations.

Planning Commission is holding a public hearing on the 19<sup>th</sup> of May at 7:00 p.m. to discuss parking and parking surface standards.

Councilman Jared Eggleston moved to table the matter for (60) sixty days. Councilman Jim Stonequist seconded. Motion passed 5 to 0.

Fire Chief Robert Thomas gave a fire department activity report.

Fire Chief Thomas informed Council that he hasn’t received final notification on the fire truck grant.

Chief Thomas informed Council of an extrication class in El Dorado being held on July 12th. He would like to send two (2) volunteers at \$250.00 each. (lunch will be provided). He also requested the city to pay for two nights of hotel.

Councilman Jim Stonequist moved to approve the extrication classes and expenses. Councilman David Rogers seconded. Motion passed 5 to 0.

Councilman moved to approve the Parson’s class for (4) with expenses. Councilman Jared Eggleston seconded. Motion passed 5 to 0.

Councilman Ron Samsel moved to allow the City Clerk to use \$2500.00 of the 2009 dump truck purchase encumbrance to pay for the \$2300.00 siren repair expense. Councilman Jim Stonequist seconded. Motion passed. 5 to 0.

Fire Chief Thomas asked Council to review an ordinance that would require burning permits within the city.

Mayor Lytle discussed holding a “Hotdog with the Mayor Day” Fire, police and ambulance services will also be present.

Councilman Jared Eggleston moved to adjourn. Councilman David Rogers seconded. Motion passed 5 to 0.

The meeting adjourned at 7:07 p.m.
