Regular Council Meeting
6:00 p.m.

The regular meeting of the Wellsville City Council was held on Wednesday, March 30, 2011 at the Wellsville City Hall meeting room, 411 Main Street. Councilmen present were Jared Eggleston, Ryan Young, Dave Rogers and Jim Stonequist. Fire Chief Robert Thomas, City Supt. Chris Cross, City Prosecutor Patrick Reavey and Building Inspector Wes Brown were also in attendance.

The pledge of allegiance and invocation were given.

Mayor Lytle called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

Councilman Dave Rogers moved to approve the consent agenda as submitted.
Councilman Jim Stonequist seconded. Motion passed 4-0

Mayor Lytle opened the meeting up for public comments that had not been previously placed on the agenda.

County Commissioner Don Stottlemire reported that they met with the Attorney General. They also signed vouchers for payment for Neosho County and will take possession April 1st.

OFCED members Blaine Finch and Tom Weigand were present to play a DVD for the council regarding the intermodle. Outside of the park they anticipate 13,000 jobs to be available. They predict the park to be completed within 15 years but most are up and running within 3-5 years. The land committee and David Lee have been in touch with Planning Commissioner Mike Brungardt regarding growth within the Wellsville Community. They will be looking for shovel ready land with a certain price point, within \$1.00 per foot and the land will need to be ready to develop.

Work force development will be held May 18th at the annex. There are two things that are needed, work force, and shovel ready land. They will be piloting the job skills institute as well including a day on the job to tour industries and talk with business professionals in our community. They will continue the process with talking job skills and mock interviews.

Planning Commissioner Mike Brungardt spoke about the Sunflower Public Water Project the goal is to have the by laws the feasibility and a water purchase contract ready for the members to consider. It is estimated the initial cost would be \$8500.00 to join the Interlocal Cooperation.

Councilman Jim Stonequist moved to enter into the interlocal agreement. Councilman Dave Rogers seconded. Motion passed 4-0.

The Council reviewed the applications for pool manager. Councilman Dave Rogers suggested the Parks committee interview the applicants and review the job description. It was suggested that Donna call the applicants to schedule interview.

Councilman Dave Rogers moved to table the motion to approve the pool manager until the next meeting when the Park committee could make recommendations to the Council. Councilman Ryan Young seconded. Motion passed 4-0.

Councilman Jim Stonequist moved to close Main Street June 4th from 11-2 for power of the past. Councilman Jarred Eggleston seconded. Motion passed 4-0.

City Supt. Chris Cross gave his departmental report. Better signage was discussed and marking all of the cross walks better. City Supt. Cross stated that all of our crosswalks are marked. Supt. Cross stated he would get costs on the signs.

Fire Chief Robert Thomas gave the fire department report. Miami County refused to help with the purchase of a computer, so our cost would be higher than expected.

The Mayor discussed that the Relay for life Chapter of Wellsville would like to put purple ribbons on poles May 27th thru June 1st.

Councilman Dave Rogers moved to adjourn. Councilman Jared Eggleston seconded. Motion passed 4-0.

The meeting adjourned at 6:59
