The regular meeting of the Wellsville City Council was held on Wednesday, August 26th 2015 at 6:00 p.m. in the Wellsville City Hall meeting room, located at 411 Main Street. Councilmen present were Jared Eggleston, Chuck Rutledge, and Cory Cunningham. Department heads present were City Superintendent Christopher Cross, Police Chief John Blair, Building Inspector Wes Brown and City Engineer Mike Brungardt.

Absent were Councilmen Dave Rogers and Ryan Eiche.

The pledge of allegiance and invocation were given.

Councilman Cory Cunningham approved the consent agenda . Councilman Chuck R. seconded. Motion passed 3-0.

The Mayor opened the meeting up for public comments. There were no comments.

The A-Coil to the air conditioner from the Fire department was discussed and bids were given to the council for their discussion and approval.

Councilman Chuck Rutledge moved to accept the Adamson Brothers bid for 700.00 to replace the A-coil. Councilman Jared Eggleston seconded. Motion passed 3-0.

City Engineer Mike Brungardt spoke regarding Ordinance 868-Allowing expansion of off street parking areas.

Councilman Cory Cunningham moved to approve Ordinance 868- Allowing off street parking areas. Councilman Chuck Rutledge seconded. Motion passed 3-0.

Councilman Jared Eggleston moved to approve Ordinance 869- text change of city zoning regulations with respect to manufactured homes. Councilman Chuck Rutledge seconded. Motion passed 3-0.

Councilman Chuck Rutledge moved to approve the amended version of Ordinance 870. Councilman Cory Cunningham seconded. Motion passed 3-0.

Councilman Chuck Rutledge moved to approve Ordinance 871 a comprehensive plan for the City of Wellsville. Councilman Jared Eggleston seconded. Motion passed 3-0.

City Engineer Mike Brungardt spoke on the Utility rate study projections and provided the council with a 5-year projection report for the 2015 Utility rate study.

Council directed City Engineer Mike Brungardt to start the second phase of the rate study.

The tablets for the Police Department vehicles were discussed again from PCS mobile. The tablets are \$2511.00 apiece for a total of \$10,044.00 this does include a 3 year warranty.

Councilman Chuck Rutledge moved to approve PCS mobile tablets at \$10,044.00 to include a 3 year warranty and shipping of \$40.00. Councilman Cory Cunningham seconded. Motion passed 3-0.

Councilman Jared Eggleston moved to approve Ka-Comm, Inc. to install computer mounts in the vehicles for a cost of \$4798.20. Councilman Cory Cunningham seconded. Motion passed 3-0.

Handicap parking was discussed on Main street near Smokey's to address easier accessibility with regards to gravel where the handicap spot is at the present time. Nicole Vlcek also stated that handicap parking at the pool needs to be addressed. Ms. Vlcek stated that the City needs to address additional parking all along mainstreet for handicap parking. Building Inspector Wes Brown will have some more information at the next meeting for the council to discuss.

City Superintendent Christopher Cross gave the Public works activity report. He stated they have been working on chip and seal and plans to have it done within the next 30 days.

Police Chief John Blair gave the Police Department activity report. Police Chief stated that the Veterans Memorial was vandalized and there was an arrest made.

Building Inspector Wes Brown gave an activity report on a property at Meadowbrook with drainage issues. The city has done some grading that hasn't been successful. Mr. Brown showed the council Ariel photos of the property and the council discussed some options. Mr. Brown stated he would like to know where to go from this point. The council agreed Mr. Brown has done all he could do at this point.

Councilman Cory Cunningham moved to adjourn the meeting. Councilman Jared Eggleston seconded. Motion passed 3-0.

Council adjourned at 7:30 p.m.
