The regular meeting of the Wellsville City Council was held on Wednesday, September 30<sup>th</sup> 2015 at 6:00 p.m. in the Wellsville City Hall meeting room, located at 411 Main Street. Councilmen present were Dave Rogers, Ryan Eiche, Jared Eggleston, Cory Cunningham and Chuck Rutledge. Department heads present were City Superintendent Christopher Cross, Police Chief John Blair, Building Inspector Wes Brown and City Prosecutor Patrick Reavey.

The pledge of allegiance and invocation were given.

Councilman Cory Cunningham moved to approve the consent agenda. Councilman Dave Rogers seconded. Motion passed 5-0.

Mayor Lytle opened the meeting up for public comments. There were no public comments.

County Commissioner Randall Renoud gave the county report.

Councilman Cory Cunningham moved to approve Resolution 01-0930-15. Councilman Chuck Rutledge seconded. Motion passed 5-0.

City Superintendent Cross gave the public works activity report. Supt. Cross stated the lift station project has begun with no issues. The chip seal project is scheduled for Monday. Supt. Cross stated Locust is on the chip seal route this year and one block is damaged beyond the point of chip seal. Supt. Cross suggested re-asphalting that block. The cost would be \$43091.80. The second option is to stabilize what is there and put 2 to 3 inches on top and chip seal it. The cost for the second option would come in at approximately half of re-asphalting.

The council talked about possible financing for the sewer lift project. Prosecutor Reavey will look into to see if this is a viable project with the 2012 Sales Tax Fund ordinance.

Superintendent Cross presented Council with a cemetery expansion cost estimate to expand 3.5 acres. The total project costs are \$23,322.13.

Councilman Dave Rogers moved to approve Public Works to construct base work on the road construction to be performed by city crews. Councilman Cory Cunningham seconded. Motion passed 5-0.

Building Inspector Wes Brown gave a report on the accessibility ramps and stated they will have a report at the next meeting. He also wanted to remind council that they will have a study session Monday October 5<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 p.m.

Chief Blair gave the police department activity report. Chief Blair stated that the Scouts are finishing up the sign and kennel at the Police Department. The Chief did say he inspected the ATV for the Wellsville Retirement Community and they passed with the addition of mirrors.

Councilman Cory Cunningham moved to go into executive session to discuss personnel for 20 minutes City Prosecutor Reavey was asked to stay. Councilman Jared Eggleston seconded. Council went into executive session at 6:50. Councilman Jared Eggleston moved to come out of executive session. Councilman Dave Rogers seconded. Motion passed 5-0. Council came out of executive session at 7:10. No motions were made and only the above mentioned item was discussed.

Councilman Dave Rogers moved to go into executive session to discuss personnel for 20 minutes City Attorney Reavey was asked to stay. Councilman Chuck Rutledge seconded. Motion passed 5-0. Council went into executive session at 7:11.

Councilman Jared Eggleston moved to come out of executive session. Councilman Dave Rogers seconded. Motion passed 5-0. Council came out of executive session at 7:31. No motions were made and only the above mentioned item was discussed.

Councilman Chuck Rutledge moved to go into executive session for 20 minutes to discuss personnel. Councilman Cory Cunningham seconded. Motion passed 5-0. City Attorney Reavey and Chief Blair was asked to stay. Council went into executive session at 7:35.

Councilman Jared Eggleston moved to come out of executive session. Councilman Ryan Eiche seconded. Motion passed 5-0. Council came out of executive session at 7:47. No motions were made and only the above mentioned item was discussed.

Councilman Cory moved to adjourn the meeting. Councilman Chuck Rutledge seconded. Motion passed 5-0.
