The regular meeting of the Wellsville City Council was held on Wednesday, January 27, 2016 at 6:00 p.m. in the Wellsville City Hall meeting room, located at 411 Main Street. Councilmen present were Jared Eggleston, Dave Rogers and Cory Cunningham. Department heads present were Christopher Cross, Police Chief John Blair, Building Inspector Wes Brown and City Engineer Mike Brungardt.

Absent were Ryan Eiche and Chuck Rutledge.

The pledge of allegiance and invocation were given.

Councilman Cory Cunningham moved to approve the consent agenda. Councilman Dave Rogers seconded. Motion passed 3-0.

Mayor Lytle opened the meeting up for public comments. There were no public comments.

Commission Randy Renoud gave the county activity report.

CPA Gregg Neis gave the net treasury report for council approval.

Councilman Cory Cunningham moved to approve the end of year report. Councilman Dave Rogers seconded. Motion passed 3-0.

City Engineer Mike Brungardt spoke about the BNSF water line crossing at the railroad tracks. The bid from Multatech came in much higher than expected. The suggestion is to put it out for bid and see what bids come in. Drexel Tech out of Lenexa is an online plan room that would be an electronic bid site. The consensus of the council was to proceed with bids.

The pool manager position was discussed. City Clerk Tammy Jones will clarify and write some rules for the next meeting, and also get the totals on pool parties and swim lessons.

City Superintendent Christopher Cross gave the Public Works activity report. Supt. Cross said the lift station is up for delivery tomorrow. Mr. Cross discussed getting a rear discharge mower at a cost of 9127.00 from McConnell Machinery. Superintendent Cross decided to get another quote from a company in Gardner.

Superintendent Cross talked about Kansas Self Storage and the confusion on the ground they own. The recommendation from City Engineer Mike Brungardt is to get a new survey done. The council agreed with that decision. City Superintendent Cross will convey the message to the land owner.

Police Chief John Blair gave the police department activity report. Chief reported that the officers were trained on the intoxilizer. Chief Blair stated he is having issues with some of the streets in town and their numbering system, specifically Maple Terrace and North and South Elm.

Chief Blair is having a Tyler Technology meeting tomorrow at Ottawa Police Department.

Building Inspector Wes Brown discussed commercial property that had renters that are living there. Mr. Brown has inspected these and taken photos if they would like to look at them.

Councilman Jared Eggleston moved to go into executive session for 5 minutes to discuss personnel. Councilman Dave Rogers seconded. Motion passed 3-0.

Council went into executive session at 6:55 p.m. City Clerk Tammy Jones and Wes Brown was asked to stay.

Councilman Jared Eggleston moved to come out of executive session. Councilman Cory Cunningham seconded. Motion passed 3-0.

Council came out of executive session at 7: 05. No motions were made and only the above mentioned item was discussed.

Councilman Cory Cunningham moved to adjourn the meeting. Councilman Jared Eggleston seconded. Motion passed 3-0.

Council adjourned at 7:06 p.m.
