The regular meeting of the Wellsville City Council was held on Wednesday, October 26, 2011 at 6:00 p.m. in the City Hall meeting room, 411 Main Street. Councilmen present were Ryan Young, Mike McAfee, Jared Eggleston, David Rogers and Cory Cunningham. Mayor Lytle was absent. Department heads present were City Supt. Christopher Cross.

The pledge of allegiance and invocation were given.

Council President Ryan Young called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

Councilman Mike McAfee entered at 6:01 p.m.

Councilman Cory Cunningham moved to approve the consent agenda as submitted. Councilman David Rogers seconded. Motion passed. 5 to 0.

Council President Ryan Young opened the meeting up for public comments that had not been previously placed on the agenda.

There were no additional public comments.

Franklin County Commissioner Don Stottlemire informed Council that the state would be installing a new computer system for the County beginning November 2nd through the 4th and again on the 7th. He stated that it probably wouldn't be a good time to be doing county business while the installation is taking place.

Commissioner Stottlemire briefly spoke on other County activities.

Supt. Cross informed Council of an anonymous donation that the City will receive for the construction of a new baby pool. The old baby pool will be demolished and a new baby pool with some additional amenities will be constructed in its place. The City Attorney has furnished a contract agreement and the pool contractor is ready to get started on the project.

Councilman Mike McAfee moved to approve the new baby pool contract contingent upon the funding by private donations and authorizes the Mayor to sign the contract, once confirmed. Councilman David Rogers seconded. Motion passed 5 to 0.

City Supt. Christopher Cross gave a public works activity report. Topics briefly discussed were waterline repairs and new sidewalk construction.

Councilman Mike McAfee asked what needs to be done about cleaning up the business across the street from City Hall.

Code Enforcement Officer Wes Brown was present and informed Council that an official complaint has not been submitted.

Council consensus was to have the Code Enforcement look into the compliance of the property.

Chief of Police Steve Gillespie was absent but provided a police department activity report for the council packets, along with some additional correspondence regarding commendations that his department has recently received.

City Clerk Donna Layton informed Council that Fire Chief Robert Thomas was unable to make the meeting but had submitted a request for two sets of leather boots at a cost not to exceed \$500.00.

Councilman Mike McAfee approved the purchase of two sets of leather boots for the city fire department, not to exceed \$500.00. Councilman Jared Eggleston seconded. Motion passed. 5 to 0.

Councilman Mike McAfee moved to adjourn. Councilman Jared Eggleston seconded. Motion passed 5 to 0.

The meeting adjourned at 6:22 p.m.
