The regular meeting of the Wellsville City Council was held on Wednesday, October 28th 2015 at 6:00 p.m. in the Wellsville City Hall meeting room, located at 411 Main Street. Councilmen present were Dave Rogers, Cory Cunningham and Jared Eggleston. Department heads present were City Superintendent Christopher Cross, Police Chief John Blair and Building Inspector Wes Brown.

Absent was Councilman Chuck Rutledge and Ryan Eiche.

The pledge of allegiance and invocation were given.

Councilman Cory Cunningham moved to approve the consent agenda. Councilman Dave Rogers seconded. Motion passed 3-0.

Mayor Lytle opened the meeting up for public comments. There were no public comments.

County Commissioner Randy Renoud gave the county activity report.

Clint Burkdoll spoke to council requesting more time on his temporary occupancy permit. Building Inspector Wes Brown gave the council a report on the work that was to be completed and has not been done yet.

Mr. Burkdoll stated that he has gotten some of the projects completed that was in the plan but he had some other projects come up and now has been delayed on the home project. He is requesting 30 more days to complete this project.

Councilman Rogers asked if he can get it done in 30 days. He stated he could.

Councilman Dave Rogers moved to give Mr. Burkdoll 30 more days from today. Councilman Cory Cunningham seconded. Motion passed 3-0.

The KCP & L electric vehicle charging station was discussed. KCP & L will bear the expense of installation; we would be responsible for covering the electric cost only through January 2017. Council consensus was to proceed with the project and see what it would entail.

Councilman Cory Cunningham moved to table the utility rate until the next meeting. Councilman Dave Rogers seconded. Motion passed 3-0.

Councilman Cory Cunningham moved to change the November 11th council meeting to the 10th due to Veterans day. Councilman Dave Rogers seconded. Motion passed 3-0.

City Superintendent Christopher Cross gave the public works activity report. The lift station project is going well. We will be waiting on the lift station next, and it may be another 30 days. Supt. Cross stated that he did get an opportunity to sweep the streets and get the dust off of them. Mr. Cross stated that he has completed 650 feet of new road for the cemetery expansion project with 283 tons of gravel and approximately \$2900.00 worth of materials.

Chief Blair gave the police department activity report. Chief Blair stated they are online with Tyler Technologies and are working on some of the details. Chief Blair stated that they are getting pricing on keyboards for the mobile tablets. Tyler Technology is coming to the Police Department on Thursday to do some in house training. Chief Blair stated he will be interviewing for the Administrative Assistants job on Friday.

Building Inspector Wes Brown stated he did attend a seminar about storm shelters. He also said in February Wellsville will host a FEMA meeting.

The Chamber of Commerce requested barricades in the area of 5th & Main between Casey's and City Hall. They are also requesting the use of the gravel lot by City Hall for hot dogs. The consensus of the council was to allow the Chamber of Commerce to use the space and to block off the areas.

Councilman Jared Eggleston moved to adjourn the meeting. Councilman Dave Rogers seconded. Motion passed 3-0.
