The regular meeting of the Wellsville City Council was held on Wednesday, November 8th 2017 at 6:00 p.m. in the Wellsville City Council meeting room, located at 411 Main Street. Councilmen present were Chuck Rutledge, Cory Cunningham, Kiel Lasswell, and Tony Stanton. Department heads present were Police Chief John Blair.

Mayor Lytle and Councilman Dave Rogers were absent.

The Pledge of allegiance and invocation was given.

Councilman Kiel Lasswell moved to approve the consent agenda. Councilman Tony Stanton seconded. Motion passed 4-0

Council President Chuck Rutledge opened the meeting up for public comments. There were no comments.

James Oltman with the FCDC gave the report on Proximity Park. They have started on some of the infrastructure. There is some right of way access that they are trying to acquire on Kingman Road and Montana Road. FCDC will be creating marketing and digital collateral on Proximity Park. James touched on a workforce plan for the County.

Over the course of last year they put together a task force and a öWork Franklin Countyö program which includes the following programs:

Franklin County R.I.S.E Program: Creating a pipeline of talent from graduating seniors.

The Professional Development Boot Camp: It provides management, leadership, soft skills training opportunities for area business partners and their employees.

The Franklin County A.C.E.S. Program: Job search resource and assistance.

Senior Day on the job: Program for area high school senior to explore career opportunities within Franklin County.

Elevate Franklin County: Recruitment to Franklin County from other regions of Kansas and other states.

Customized Workforce Training Programs: Commitment from Neosho County Community College and USD 290 to offer customized CTE training programs to meet potential business needs.

The application for Highway access, which includes removing access from K-33 to the Wellsville Market (The new location of Casey's) was brought to council for approval.

Councilman Tony Stanton moved to approve the application to remove Highway access from K-33 into the new Casey's. Councilman Kiel Lasswell seconded. Motion passed 4-0.

Police Chief John Blair gave the police department activity report.

Councilman Tony Stanton moved to adjourn the meeting. Councilman Cory Cunningham seconded. Motion passed 4-0.
