The regular meeting of the Wellsville City Council was held on Tuesday November 24th 2015 at 6:00 p.m. in the Wellsville City Hall meeting room, located at 411 Main Street. Councilmen present were Cory Cunningham, Chuck Rutledge and Jared Eggleston. Department heads present were Police Chief John Blair and Building Inspector Wes Brown.

Absent were Councilmen Ryan Eiche and Dave Rogers.

The pledge of allegiance and invocation were given.

Councilman Chuck Rutledge moved to approve the consent agenda. Councilman Cory Cunningham seconded. Motion passed 3-0.

Mayor Lytle opened the meeting up for public comments. There were no comments.

The subject for accepting donations for the Wellsville Days committee and the Chamber wine and brew was discussed at length. The consensus of the council was to table this item and the City Clerk will discuss it with Gregg Neis at length.

Councilman Jared Eggleston moved to table the donation item until the next meeting. Councilman Chuck Rutledge seconded. Motion passed 3-0.

Chamber President Nicole Vlcek discussed a working relationship with the Council regarding Christmas lights, flower basket program, Christmas tree lighting etc.

Building Inspector Wes Brown talked about Resolution 01-1124-15 and Resolution the accumulation of metal, masonry products, and junk on the driveway and yard, and on and across a wooden deck in the yard at 305 Pine.

Councilman Chuck Rutledge requested Building Inspector Wes Brown try to make contact one more time before the letters are sent and the Resolutions are published before the next council meeting. Councilman Jared Eggleston seconded. Motion passed 3-0.

Councilman Cory Cunningham moved to pass the Christmas bonuses of \$750.00 for full time and \$375.00 for Part time employees. Councilman Chuck Rutledge seconded. Motion passed 3-0.

Chief John Blair gave the police department activity report.

Building Inspector Wes Brown spoke about backflow prevention. Mr. Brown gave an example/ outline of how this program could possibly work along with letters and fines

that may be involved. The consensus was to get with the City Attorney and check with other cities and find out their current programs and what they have in place.

Councilman Cory Cunningham moved to adjourn the meeting. Councilman Jared Eggleston seconded. Motion passed 3-0.
