The regular meeting of the Wellsville City Council was held on Wednesday, December 10 2014 at 6:00 p.m. in the Wellsville City Hall meeting room, located at 411 Main Street. Councilmen present were Jared Eggleston, Chuck Rutledge, Dave Rogers, Cory Cunningham. Department heads present were City Superintendent Christopher Cross, Police Chief John Blair and Building Inspector Wes Brown. City Engineer Mike Brungardt was also present.

Councilman Ryan Eiche was absent.

Councilman Cory Cunningham moved to approve the consent agenda. Councilman Dave Rogers seconded. Motion passed 4-0

The Mayor opened the hearing up for public comments. There were no public comments.

Commissioner Don Stottlemire gave the county activity report. Don's last day as commissioner will be January 12<sup>th</sup>. The Mayor and council thanked him for his years of service.

Jeff Seymour with the Franklin County Economic Development gave an overview on the last year and our working relationship. The city of Ottawa acquired 303 acres by the Loves exit. Mr. Seymour also spoke about membership dues. Dues last year were \$1000.00 he is asking for the Council to consider raising that fee in 2015.

Councilman Dave Rogers moved to pay the Franklin County Economic Development \$2500.00. Councilman Cory Cunningham seconded. Motion passed 4-0.

Mike Brungardt spoke about the special use permitted upon review. The applicant is asking that special use be permitted for a window assembly business at 518 East 7<sup>th</sup> Street Wellsville, Kansas.

Councilman Dave Rogers moved to approve Ordinance 866 and ordinance granting a use permitted upon review for operation of a window assembly business at 518 East 7<sup>th</sup> Street in Wellsville, Ks. Councilman Chuck Rutledge seconded. Motion passed 5-0.

Citizen Dean Kramer wanted to lodge a complaint on 948 Main. He stated there is lots of trash, and they have been burning trash in the open.

Councilman Chuck Rutledge moved to approve Resolution 01-1210-14 A Resolution waiving GAAP requirements and conforming to the requirements of K.S.A. 1120a requiring financial reports prepared on the basis of cash receipts and disbursements to show compliance with the cash basis and budget laws of Kansas.

Councilman Jared Eggleston seconded . Motion passed 4-0

Councilman Dave Rogers moved to approve the CMB license's for Chili Jacks, Hurricane Sherry's, Casey's, Big Boppers and Smokey's. Councilman Cory Cunningham seconded. Motion passed 4-0.

City Superintendent Christopher Cross gave the public works activity report. Supt. Cross spoke about the need of a new building and where the funds would come from.

Councilman Jared Eggleston moved to authorize the city auditor to transfer \$15,000 from the general street fund to the Public Works New Equipment fund upon completion of a satisfactory audit of the city's general fund.

Councilman Dave Rogers seconded. Motion passed 4-0.

Police Chief John Blair gave the police department activity report. Chief Blair said that he had a request for the bicycles that the Police Department has stored from a local minister to refurbish and hand out to needy kids. Don Stottlemire also has a program that would benefit Lake Region RC & D. Chief Blair also asked to encumber any remaining monies in the Police Department budget.

Councilman Cory Cunningham moved to give the bikes to Lake Region RC & D. Councilman Chuck Rutledge seconded. Motion passed 4-0.

Building Inspector Wes Brown gave an activity report.

Councilman Jared Eggleston moved to authorize the city auditor to transfer any remaining balance remaining balance in the Police department fund to the Police Department equipment reserve fund, upon completion of a satisfactory audit of the city's general fund.

Councilman Cory Cunningham seconded. Motion passed 4-0.

Councilman Eggleston stated the Fire Department needs ballast replaced in the Fire Department. City Superintendent Chris Cross said he would repair anything needing replaced.

Councilman Cory Cunningham moved to adjourn the meeting. Councilman Chuck Rutledge seconded. Motion passed 4-0.

Meeting adjourned at 7:10 p.m.
