The regular meeting of the Wellsville City Council was held on Wednesday, February 12, 2014 at 6:00 p.m. in the Wellsville City Hall meeting room, located at 411 Main Street. Councilmen present were Jared Eggleston, Travis Jones, Mike McAfee and Dave Edwards. Councilman Cory Cunningham was absent. Department heads present were City Superintendent Chris Cross, Building Inspector Wes Brown and Chief John Blair.

The pledge of allegiance and invocation were given.

Mayor Lytle called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

Councilman Dave Edwards moved to approve the consent agenda. Councilman Travis Jones seconded. Motion passed 4-0

Mayor Lytle opened the meeting up for public comments that had not been previously placed on the agenda.

The Mayor discussed Committee assignments and it was stated that committee's do not make any decisions.

Harold Taylor spoke about interviewing a police chief and the interview process. Mr. Taylor recommended that a member of the school board and a member of the community be involved.

Commissioner Don Stottlemire gave the County activity report. Don spoke about the 2014 Official Visitors Guide. Don stated he did file for re-election. The Commission agreed a 3% loan to refurbish the old Neosho College.

Building Official Wes Brown spoke regarding Resolution No. 001-212-2014 at address 315 West 4th.

Councilman Cory Cunningham came in to the meeting at 6:30 p.m.

Councilman Travis Jones moved to adopt Resolution No. 001-212-2014. Councilman Mike McAfee seconded. Motion passed 5-0.

Councilman Mike McAfee motioned for the Police to serve Mr. Moyer with the letter. Councilman Dave Edwards seconded. Motion passed 5-0.

Committee assignments were discussed as was the employee relations committee and their usefulness.

Councilman Dave Edwards moved to do away with the committee assignment list. Councilman Cory Cunningham seconded. Motion passed 5-0.

Councilman Cory Cunningham moved to meet Monday February 17th for a work study session at 6:00 p.m. Councilman Dave Edwards seconded. Motion passed 5-0.

City Superintendent Christopher Cross gave the Public Works activity report. Chris said he is still working with engineers for the sewer and had met with them yesterday. The standby generators were discussed. The pads were set but nothing else has been done due to the weather.

Chief John Blair gave the Police department activity report. It was discussed that Chief Blair proceed and pay someone to take the equipment out of the wrecked car.

Building Inspector Wes Brown spoke about the property at 315 West 4th Street about other violations besides the vehicles. The discussion of the building permit length of time was discussed. It has been 10 to 12 months since any work has been done. The council discussed having an expiration date on the building permit.

Wes also talked about the flat screen TV for the Council chambers.

Councilman Mike McAfee moved to buy 1-60 inch Smart TV for the council meeting room, wireless internet and brackets with installation were also approved. Councilman Dave Edwards seconded. Motion passed 5-0.

Mayor Lytle spoke about the flower basket program and the cost involved with providing the flowers, which is done with donations from the community.

The Mayor spoke about the building at 418 Main and informed the council that the Historical Society had purchased it and they have an architect and is planning on restoring the building.

Councilman Mike McAfee moved to adjourn. Councilman Dave Edwards seconded. Motion passed 5-0.
