The regular meeting of the Wellsville City Council was held on Wednesday, April 12th 2017 at 6:00 p.m. in the Wellsville City Council meeting room, located at 411 Main Street. Councilmen present were Tony Stanton, Kiel Lasswell, Cory Cunningham and Dave Rogers. Department heads present were City Superintendent Christopher Cross, Officer James Coughlin sat in for Chief Blair.

Councilman Chuck Rutledge was absent.

Mayor Lytle called the meeting to order.

Councilman Cory Cunningham moved to approve the consent agenda. Councilman Tony Stanton seconded. Motion passed 4-0.

Mayor Lytle opened the meeting up for public comments. There were no comments.

County Commissioner Randy Renoud gave the County activity report.

Ordinance 885 – Codification Ordinance adopting a new city code was discussed.

Councilman Dave Rogers moved to approve ordinance 885. Councilman Tony Stanton seconded. Motion passed 4-0.

The City Wide Clean up mailing was discussed, along with the cost of mailing the post cards out to Wellsville Citizens. The cost of the mailing is \$825.00.

Councilman Cory Cunningham moved to approve the cost of the mailing in the amount of \$825.00. Councilman Tony Stanton seconded. Motion passed 4-0.

City Superintendent Christopher Cross gave the public works activity report. Mr. Cross stated that he was having problems with some of the pumps and the mixer at the sewer plant. They are also having some electrical problems. The cost may be upward of \$10,000.

Mr. Cross asked about hiring a full time person, entry level at \$9-10.00 per hour, that includes insurance and KPERS. Council agreed to let Mr. Cross advertise for a full time Public works person.

Councilman Tony Stanton moved to approve up to \$12,000 to fix the problems at the Sewer plant. The money would be taken out of the sewer impact fund. Councilman Kiel Lasswell seconded. Motion passed 4-0.

Officer James Coughlin gave the police department activity report for Chief Blair. Officer Coughlin asked if the Police Department could sale the 2005 Chevy Impala that was an old police car since it was no longer being used.

Councilman Cory Cunningham moved to approve the sale of the 05 Chevy Impala. Councilman Kiel Lasswell seconded. Motion passed 4-0.

Councilman Tony Stanton moved to adjourn the meeting. Councilman Cory Cunningham seconded. Motion passed 4-0.
