The regular meeting of the Wellsville City Council meeting was held on Wednesday, June 29, 2011 at 6:00 p.m. in the Wellsville City Hall meeting room., 411 Main St. Wellsville, Ks. Councilmen present were Jared Eggleston, Ryan Young, Mike McAfee and Cory Cunningham. Dave Rogers was absent. Department heads present were City Supt. Chris Cross, Chief of Police Steve Gillespie, Fire Chief Robert Thomas and City Attorney Patrick Reavey.

The pledge of allegiance and invocation were given.

Mayor Lytle called the meeting to order at 6:00

Councilman Mike McAfee moved to approve the consent agenda as submitted. Councilman Jared Eggleston seconded. Motion passed 4-0

Fr. County Commissioner Don Stottlemire gave the Counties activity report. The Health department is trying to establish a low income service, which all the physicians will all volunteer their time.

Kevin Jones with the Wellsville Days Committee spoke about Ty Herndon coming to town and approximately bringing in 500-750 people to the concert. Kevin spoke about having a 3-day event with a scavenger hunt on Friday, and a church service and 5-K run on Sunday.

Scott Averill spoke regarding a special use permit for a golf cart for the Wellsville Retirement Community. Mr. Averill spoke regarding the golf cart they purchased for the Retirement Community and being unable to get it tagged because it is gas powered. He stated that all drivers have to have a valid driver's license. He also stated the golf cart does have four seatbelts. City Attorney Patrick Reavey spoke about the current ordinance that the City has. The ordinance 753 that is currently on the books. The STO that the city has adopted currently states that the golf cart has to be tagged. Chief Gillespie spoke regarding the safety issues and making exceptions to the rule. Mr. Averill also stated that he is fully insured. It was the consensus of the council to have Mr. Reavey look into the ordinances that Burlington and Osage City currently has in place regarding golf carts.

Councilman Cory Cunningham motioned to have Patrick Reavey review ordinance 753. Councilman Mike McAfee seconded. Motion passed 4-0.

City Attorney Patrick Reavey spoke about the changes in DUI laws and the cost of publishing the ordinances in the paper. Patrick suggested that we send all DUI's to the County and adopt the new STO book when it comes out with the changes.

The consensus of the council is to send DUI's to the County until the new STO book comes out.

Councilman Jared Eggleston moved to adopt ordinance 831 regarding the seatbelt fines. Councilman Mike McAfee seconded. Motion passed 4-0.

CPA Greg Neiss spoke regarding the budget and suggested setting up a special budget meeting in July.

Councilman Jared Eggleston moved to have a budget workshop on July 6<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 p.m. at Wellsville City Hall. Councilman Mike McAfee seconded. Motion passed 4-0.

Chief Gillespie gave the police department activity report. Chief Gillespie also handed the council a memo regarding police vehicles.

Fire Chief Robert Thomas gave the Fire Department activity report. Chief Thomas stated he is looking into 6 pagers for approximately \$2800.00. Fire Chief Thomas also stated he needs two sets of bunker gear at an approximate cost of \$3600.00.

Councilman Mike McAfee moved to purchase 6 pagers not to exceed \$2800.00 and bunker gear not to exceed \$3600.00. Councilman Eggleston seconded. Motion passed 4-0

City Supt. Chris Cross gave the utility department report. The storm sirens are in and functioning as designed. Supt. Cross stated that he has the old sirens and asked what the council would like to do with those. Supt. Cross recommended the City donate those to a town that does not have one.

Councilman Jared Eggleston moved to transfer \$5000.00 from the park impact fund to cover extra costs at the pool. Councilman Ryan Young seconded. Motion passed 4-0.

Supt. Chris Cross stated they need to repair the street on Pendleton. Supt. Cross gave several options. Option #1 to do a triple chip seal at \$62,000 with a 10-15 yr. life span. Option #2 an asphalt option with no curb and gutter or storm drains at about \$175,000. Option #3 an asphalt option with curb and gutters at roughly \$400,000. Supt. Cross stated he is thinking of doing a two inch overlay on 7<sup>th</sup> street at a cost of \$62,815.50.

Councilman Jared Eggleston moved to do a two inch over lay on 7<sup>th</sup> street. Councilman Mike McAfee seconded. Motion passed 4-0.

Councilman Jared Eggleston moved to hire Mike Brungardt to do a water study at a rate of \$60.00 per hour and not to exceed 10 hours. Councilman McAfee seconded. Motion passed 4-0.

Mayor Lytle asked to go into executive session to discuss personnel.

Councilman Jared Eggleston motioned to go into executive session for 10 minutes to discuss personnel. Councilman Mike McAfee seconded. The council went into executive session at 7:27. City Attorney Patrick Reavey was asked to stay.

Councilman Jared Eggleston moved to come out of executive session with no action taken at 7:37 with no other topics discussed. Councilman Ryan Young seconded. Motion passed 4-0.

There was a motion to adjourn by Councilman McAfee. Councilman Eggleston voted not to adjourn to discuss the police cars. Councilman Cunningham and Councilman McAfee voted to Adjourn. Mayor Lytle voted not to adjourn to discuss the vehicles.

The council discussed the memo that Chief Gillespie handed them regarding the new police cars. The consensus was for the Chief to get some quotes on other vehicles with new equipment.

Councilman moved to adjourn the meeting. Councilman Eggleston seconded. Motion passed 4-0.

The meeting adjourned at 7:55
