The regular meeting of the Wellsville City Council was held on Wednesday, June 29th 2016 at 6:00 p.m. in the Wellsville City Hall meeting room, located at 411 Main Street. Councilmen present were Jared Eggleston, Chuck Rutledge, Cory Cunningham and Ryan Eiche. Department heads present were City Superintendent Christopher Cross, Building Inspector Wes Brown, City Engineer Mike Brungardt and Police Chief John Blair.

City Councilman Dave Rogers was absent.

The pledge of allegiance and Invocation were given.

Councilman Cory Cunningham moved to approve the consent agenda. Councilman Chuck Rutledge seconded. Motion passed 4-0.

Mayor Lytle opened the meeting up for public comments. There were no public comments.

Commissioner Randy Renoud gave the county report. The county is asking for a new bridge on Texas road. They also approved a grant for the hospital. Ottawa will be putting in a play park for teenagers and are looking for funds for this project. Emergency management is working with FEMA on storm-water damage from recent storms.

Clint Moore spoke to the council about blocking the road between Meadowbrook Lane which is a cul-de-sac on July 3rd from noon to 10:00 p.m. for fireworks.

Councilman Chuck Rutledge motioned to allow the blocking of Meadowbrook Lane on July 3rd from noon to 10:00 p.m. Council also said we would provide barricades. Councilman Cory Cunningham seconded. Motion passed 4-0.

CPA Gregg Neis talked about the budget meeting and available dates. A meeting date of July 19th at 6:00 p.m. was agreed upon.

City Engineer Mike Brungardt spoke about new sidewalks-pedestrian walks to the new Dollar General location. The first thing we would need would be to get an easement for a sidewalk from 6th street across Poplar to the Dollar General. The crosswalk would have pre warning signage and a striped walkway. If the City wants to move forward the next step is to check on the easement and retain a consulting firm with design layout and a crossing design. Mike suggested he could talk to some consultants before the next meeting. The consensus was to talk to the landowner first before moving forward.

The Musco finance landlord subordination contract was presented from the WJRC. Our City Attorney has looked over the language and made the necessary changes.

Councilman Cory Cunningham moved to approve Mayor Lytle to sign the original agreement when it arrives. Councilman Ryan Eiche seconded. Motion passed 4-0.

City Superintendent Christopher Cross gave a public works update. Supt. Cross stated that the shipping of the new water meters will be delayed for another month.

Chief John Blair gave a police department activity report. Chief gave an update on the hail damage and the costs of the repairs are \$1923.95 and \$2243.25 per vehicle, Chief Blair also stated they have had several scams in town recently.

Building Inspector Wes Brown had no report.

Councilman Jared moved to adjourn the meeting. Councilman Cory Cunningham seconded. Motion passed 4-0.

Council adjourned at 6:47 p.m.
