The regular meeting of the Wellsville City Council was held on Wednesday, September 10, 2014 at 6:00 p.m. in the Wellsville City Hall meeting room, located at 411 Main Street. Councilmen present were Jared Eggleston, Dave Edwards, Cory Cunningham . Department heads present were Chief Blair, City Superintendent Christopher Cross and Building Inspector Wes Brown.

Councilman Dave Rogers and Mike McAfee were absent.

The Mayor opened the hearing up for public comments.

Councilman Dave Edwards moved to approve the consent agenda. Councilman Cory Cunningham seconded. Motion passed 3-0

Mayor Lytle opened the floor for public comments. Clayton Neel spoke to thank the Council for all of their support for the cars show.

Commissioner Don Stottlemire gave the County activity report. He stated that they donated \$200.00 for the Veterans Day celebration. The Council approved to move forward with upgrading the ambulance department.

Alicia Jones spoke regarding Wellsville Days. She stated they are wanting to close 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> on Main from 1-6:30 for the train and the safety issues. She gave the parade route and a list of events for the evening.

Councilman Cory Cunningham moved to approve Resolution 01-910-14 Hazard Mitigation plan. Councilman Jared Eggleston seconded. Motion passed 3-0.

The Mayor spoke about the memo about replacing the RR Bridge on K33 in 2019. The consensus was to let City Superintendent and City Engineer see what options are available.

Councilman Cory Cunningham moved to approve the special use application for Hurricane Sherry's. Councilman Jared Eggleston seconded. Motion passed 3-0

Councilman Cory Cunningham moved to approve using Midwest Fidelity to collect some of our old water debt. Councilman Dave Edwards seconded. Motion passed 3-0.

City Superintendent Christopher Cross gave the public works activity report. Chris spoke about the Glenwood lift station; the consensus of the council was to get a bid on a new pump.

Chief John Blair gave the Police Department activity report. Chief Blair stated the School Safety study is finished and available. Officer Carlson started with the Police Department on September 2<sup>nd</sup>. He also stated a new Administrative assistant was hired on 9-8-14. He also stated that the magnetic signs are in for the Police Car.

Councilman Cory Cunningham spoke about the Maple Terrace road where people seem to be speeding. He asked about a stop sign. They spoke about a stop sign on Maple Terrace and Downey. The other options were to put in a speed bump but City Superintendent Cross stated that grating that would be a problem.

Councilman Dave Edwards move to approve putting stop signs at Maple Terrace and Downey and to give people 30 days to adjust to the sign with a warning ticket if necessary. Councilman Cory Cunningham seconded. Motion passed 3-0.

Building Inspector Wes Brown requested \$349.00 for a lap top.

Councilman Jared Eggleston moved to approve a laptop for \$349.00. Councilman Dave Edwards seconded. Motion passed 3-0

Building Inspector Wes Brown asked for a study session to discuss some items that he wants to go over with the Council.

Consensus with the Council was to have a study session on 9-22-14 at 6:00 p.m.

Councilman Dave Edwards moved to adjourn. Councilman Cory Cunningham seconded. Motion passed 3-0.
