The regular meeting of the Wellsville City Council was held on Wednesday, October 31st 2018 at 6:00 p.m. in the Wellsville City Council meeting room located at 411 Main Street. Councilmen present were Chuck Rutledge, Cory Cunningham, Kiel Lasswell, David Rogers and Tony Stanton. Department heads present were Chief John Blair and Building and codes official Jerry Mallory.

Councilman Chuck Rutledge moved to approve the consent. Councilmen Tony Stanton seconded. Motion passed 5-0.

Mayor Lytle opened the meeting up for public comments there were no comments.

County Commissioner Randy Renoud gave the County report. They approved to allow the Ottawa Recreation on Dec. 8th to have a candy cane parade and they requested it be on the Court House lawn. Mr. Renoud stated that Wellsville was one of the biggest polling locations. He also stated they will canvass votes the 13th of November.

The truck bed claim regarding Mr. Michael Smith was discussed. The Cities Insurance Company has looked at it twice and denied the claim stating that the City was not legally responsible since the City did not know prior that the pole was damaged or may fall.

Councilman David Rogers moved to follow the insurance guidelines and not pay Mr. Smith. Councilman Cory Cunningham seconded. Motion passed 5-0.

The Debt Issuance Compliance Policy, which states that the city will comply fully with all applicable requirements of State and Federal law pertaining to issuance and existence of governmental bonds, including, but not limited to, provisions of the Federal Internal Revenue Coded was reviewed. .

Councilman Kiel Lasswell moved to approve the Debt Issuance Compliance Policy. Councilman Chuck Rutledge seconded. Motion passed 5-0.

Ordinance 902 - Ordinance authorizing the issuance of aggregate principal General Obligation Bonds, Series 2018 was brought before Council.

Councilman Tony Stanton moved to approve Ordinance 902. Councilman David Rogers seconded. Motion passed 5-0

Resolution No.01-1031-2018 was brought before council for approval. A Resolution prescribing the form of details of General Obligation bonds, Series 2018.

Councilman Cory Cunningham moved to approve Resolution No. 01-1031-2018. Councilman Chuck Rutledge seconded. Motion passed 5-0.

Ordinance 903 was discussed which authorizes the taxable industrial revenue bonds.(DT Properties).

Councilman Cory Cunningham moved. Councilman Chuck Rutledge seconded. Motion passed 5-0.

The design team for McClure will need an additional \$7,000 to design the water and sewer main between 8th Street and DT Properties south property line along K-33.

Councilman Chuck Rutledge moved to accept the extra cost from McClure Engineering. Councilman Cory Cunningham seconded. Motion passed 5-0.

Chief John Blair gave the police department activity report. Chief Blair stated that they had some vicious dogs loose in the community and is requesting looking at a tranquilizer gun. An entry level weapon starts at \$250.00 to \$500.00.

Chief Blair stated that the new Officer Job opening is on the website and we have received a couple of applications.

Chief Blair discussed with the council his concerns with the parking on East 7th street there are 17 driveways on the south and 11 driveways on the north. The Chiefs recommendation is to put no parking signs on both sides of the road for safety reasons.

The consensus is to put door hangars to warn the houses on 7th street that there will be no parking on either side and warning tickets would be issued until the first of the year.

Jerry Mallory gave his report regarding the fire on South Main recently and he is working with the Insurance Company to make sure the house gets taken down properly.

Councilman Tony Stanton moved to adjourn the meeting. Councilman Kiel Lasswell seconded. Motion passed 5-0.
