The regular meeting of the Wellsville City Council was held on Wednesday, June 13th 2018 at 6:00 p.m. in the Wellsville City Council meeting room, located at 411 Main Street. Councilmen present were David Rogers, Kiel Lasswell, Chuck Rutledge, Tony Stanton and Cory Cunningham. Department heads present were Police Chief John Blair, City Superintendent and Building and Planning official Jerry Mallory.

The Pledge of allegiance and invocation was given.

Councilman Chuck Rutledge moved to approve the consent agenda. Councilman Dave Rogers seconded. Motion passed 5-0.

Mayor Lytle opened the meeting up for public comments. There were no comments.

Commissioner Randy Renoud gave the County report.

Elba Unruh's 14th annual block party is on Saturday June 30th at 7:30 p.m. on Prairie Lane. Elba usually blocks off the street and the City will provide the barricades.

The kiddie parade will be July 4th at 10:00 a.m. and will start at the school and end at the park.

The Historical Society will be having a fundraiser on July 14th at Milestone events.

City Superintendent Darien Kerr asked council if we could hire Levi Harn 1-2 hours per week for consultation purposes. Mr. Harn asked for \$30.00 per hour plus mileage.

Councilman Chuck Rutledge moved to approve Levi Harn as a temporary employee at \$30.00 per hour at 1-2 hours per week plus mileage. Councilman Dave Rogers seconded. Motion passed 5-0.

Superintendent Kerr stated they are missing a mixer at the sewer plant. The mixer is \$7354.00 plus freight from Douglas Pump.

Councilman Dave Rogers moved to approve the mixer from Douglas Pump at a cost of \$7354.00 plus freight. Councilman Cory Cunningham seconded. Motion passed 5-0.

Building and planning official Jerry Mallory gave a building and planning report and stated that North Star Housing will be going ahead with the 18 homes off of West 4th street.

Police Chief John Blair gave the police department activity report. The SRO Grant is being put on hold due to some type of legislation that arose.

Mayor Lytle read a letter from Casey's stating that they will not keep the Main Street Store open due to staffing.

Cory Cunningham moved to adjourn the meeting. Councilman Kiel Lasswell seconded. Motion passed 5-0.
