The regular meeting of the Wellsville City Council was held on Wednesday, December 12th 2018 at 6:00 p.m. in the Wellsville City Council meeting room located at 411 Main Street. Councilmen present were David Rogers, Tony Stanton, Chuck Rutledge, Cory Cunningham and Kiel Lasswell. Department heads present were Police Chief John Blair and Building and Planning official Jerry Mallory.

Councilman Chuck Rutledge moved to approve the consent agenda. Councilman Tony Stanton seconded. Motion passed 5-0.

Mayor Lytle opened the meeting up for public comments. There were no public comments.

Council discussed Wayne and Marie Linderø request for the City to vacate the easement right of way at 506 Pine Street. Council consensus was to let the Linderø go ahead with a survey and then a public meeting would have to be held.

Council discussed changing the pay dates to bi-weekly due to the Police Department getting a fifth officer and paying overtime.

Councilman Chuck Rutledge moved to adopt a bi-weekly pay schedule. Councilman Cory Cunningham seconded. Motion passed 5-0

Gregg Neis presented the 2017 audit findings to council.

Councilman Cory Cunningham moved to approve the audit as presented. Councilman David Rogers seconded. Motion passed 5-0.

Councilman David Rogers moved to approve City employees to have Christmas Eve and New Yearø Eve off. Councilman Cory Cunningham seconded. Motion passed 5-0.

Chief John Blair gave the police department activity report. Chief attended a class in Topeka for the computer system. Chief Blair stated that Officer Hackler wants to do a cram the cruiser, which would be donations of food for the food pantry here in Wellsville.

Council thought that would be a great idea and our Community would benefit.

Building official Jerry Mallory gave the planning department updates. The owners at 917 Main have been doing a good job at cleaning up he reported.

Councilman David Rogers moved to adjourn the meeting. Councilman Chuck Rutledge seconded. Motion passed 5-0.
