The regular meeting of the Wellsville City Council was held on Wednesday, April 10<sup>th</sup>, 2019 at 6:00 p.m. in the Wellsville City Hall meeting room located at 411 Main Street. Councilmen present were Chuck Rutledge, Dave Rogers, Tony Stanton, Kiel Lasswell and Cory Cunningham. Department heads present were Police Chief John Blair and Building and planning official Pat Burton.

The pledge of allegiance and invocation were given.

Councilman Tony Stanton moved to approve the consent agenda. Councilman Chuck Rutledge seconded. Motion passed 5-0.

Mr. Knoedler with Wreaths across Franklin County gave a presentation and was asking for donations. They are made up of Franklin County Volunteer who are working to make sure none of our fallen home town Veterans are forgotten. The goal is to place a wreath on every Veteran's grave in Franklin County. The wreaths cost roughly \$10.00 per wreath.

They still need at least 2500 wreaths & ribbons. There is over 4,000 Veterans, buried in Franklin county and have been losing four to five Veterans each month

Councilman Chuck Rutledge moved to approve a \$500.00 donation to wreaths across Franklin County. Councilman Tony Stanton seconded. Motion passed 5-0.

Commissioner Stottlemire gave the activity report for the county. Mr. Derek Brown with the County was present as well. They went out for bids for trash service; they ended up going with Gardner Disposal for 1 year. David lee filed his plans for all of the work with KDOT for the next year.

Derek Brown wanted to speak about Stafford Terrace and funding to help with that project. Derek stated that a partnership with Wellsville is very important to him. Mr. Brown said he is going to ask his board for significant help with the road project.

Elijah Roe at 502 E 3<sup>rd</sup> had a city sewer back up at his home.

Councilman Kiel Lasswell moved to approve the installment of a backwater valve at 502 E. 3<sup>rd</sup>. Councilman Chuck Rutledge seconded. Motion passed 5-0

Council asked Mr. Roe to send an estimate to the City Clerk. Council also asked the City Clerk to contact our insurance company regarding the claim.

Chili Jacks asked for a special events permit for the alumni banquet on May 11<sup>th</sup>. Councilman Cory Cunningham moved to approve the special events permit. Councilman Chuck Rutledge seconded. Motion passed 5-0.

Chief Blair gave the police department activity report. The police price for the Ford interceptors have gone up \$5000.00. The Chief stated that the new chargers are all wheel drive and \$9,000.00 less than the interceptors.

Building official Pat Burton gave the activity report. Keim has broke ground today. He has been working with DT properties as well.

Becky Dodd with the Library talked to council and said that in front of the handicap spot there is a drain and it plugs up a lot and creates some issues. The Library board is looking to put together a board for fundraising for the building. She would like to have some of the council to attend a building community meeting.

Councilman Cory Cunningham moved to adjourn the meeting. Councilman Tony Stanton seconded. Motion passed 5-0.
