The regular meeting of the Wellsville City Hall Council was held on Wednesday, May 27th, 2020 at 6:00 p.m. in the Wellsville City Hall meeting room, located at 411 Main Street. Councilmen present were Dave Rogers, Tony Stanton, Chuck Rutledge, Cory Cunningham and Natalie Patton.

The pledge of allegiance and invocation were given.

Councilman Cory Cunningham moved to approve the consent agenda and the minutes of the previous meeting as presented. Councilman Tony Stanton seconded. Motion passed 5-0.

Mayor Lytle opened the meeting up for public comments. There were no public comments.

Mary Ann Chambers was present to discuss the pool.

Mary Ann suggested opening and letting the public in up to 40 in 2 hour increments. Closing and cleaning and then re-opening. Everything will run in 2 hour increments. Discussion was that only Wellsville residents would be allowed or USD 289 students. Signage will be supplied along with a thermometer. Everyone would be required to sign in. The City will be responsible for the concessions which will only include wrapped items and canned soda and water.

The pool will open June 15th and the cost will be \$2.00 per person with a maximum of 40 people. No pool chairs will be provided and will be removed because of the intensity of cleaning required.

City Superintendent Darien Kerr gave the public works activity report.

City Superintendent Kerr gave the council bids on the Maple Terrace install bid for sanitary sewer extension which includes connection to existing main, 120 linear feet of 8" SDR 26 piping, 100 linear feet of 6" SDR 26 service line, 1 new manhole, connect existing service, backfill and testing. Cohorst bid was \$17,400 and Davis Excavating was \$17,800.

Councilman Cory Cunningham moved to award the bid to Cohorst Enterprises for the sanitary sewer line in the amount of \$17,400. Councilman Chuck Rutledge seconded. Motion passed 5-0.

Darien said the chip and seal is in town and is almost finished and went well.

The Pine street sewer project has started this week.

The radiator on the dump truck blew up last week; as soon as it is fixed he will work on the 4th street asphalt project.

Building Inspector Pat Burton gave the Building and Codes report. He stated that the project on 4th street is near complete.

Councilman Cory Cunningham moved to adjourn the meeting. Councilman Tony Stanton seconded. Motion passed 5-0.
