The regular meeting of the Wellsville City Hall council was held on Wednesday, June 10th, 2020 at 6:00 p.m. in the Wellsville City Hall meeting room, located at 411 Main Street. Councilmen present were Chuck Rutledge, Tony Stanton and Natalie Patton. Department heads present were Superintendent Darien Kerr and Building and Codes official Pat Burton.

The pledge of allegiance and invocation were given.

Councilman Tony Stanton moved to approve the consent agenda and the minutes of the previous meeting. Councilwoman Natalie Patton seconded. Motion passed 3-0.

Mayor Lytle opened the meeting up for public comments. Paul Been from FRCO stated that the County has received a grant for small businesses for \$132,000. You can go to the Franklin County website and get the paperwork. They will not be able to accept applications as yet. There will be a committee to look over the applications for approval. Once its approved invoices will need to be provided to the committee before any checks have been cut.

County Commissioner Don Stottlemire gave the County activity report. They bid to have the courthouse repainted the low bid was \$140,000. The company dropped the price and the job has been done. They will start working on the budget on Monday. Don stated they have had 8 new COVID cases since Monday. They are providing testing to all the First Responders for free.

A call out module-alert notification in the amount of \$900.00 was presented to the council for emergencies and notifications to the public it would tie into our current Jayhawk system and PSN payment service network system.

Tony Stanton moved to approve the module up to \$1200.00. Councilman Chuck Rutledge seconded. Motion passed 3-0.

City Superintendent Darien Kerr gave the public works activity report. Darien stated that RG Fiber cut our water line on Monday night. Darien stated that it took them 7 hours to repair.

Darien stated that the boil order has been lifted.

Building and Codes official Pat Burton gave the building report. Pat stated that the Pine street sewer project has had some issues and Blue Nile has had to have a couple of houses cleaned, but they have been very responsive.

Councilman Chuck Rutledge moved to adjourn the meeting. Councilman Tony Stanton seconded. Motion passed 3-0.
