The regular meeting of the Wellsville City Council was held on Wednesday, August 11th, 2021 at 6:00 p.m. in the Wellsville City Hall meeting room, located at 411 Main Street.

Councilmen present were Chuck Rutledge, Cory Cunningham, Luke Henry, Dave Rogers and Natalie Patton. Department heads present were City Superintendent Darien Kerr and Chief of Police Danny Hackler.

The pledge of allegiance and invocation were given.

Mayor Lytle called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

Councilman Dave Rogers moved to approve the minutes from the July 28th meeting and the consent agenda. Councilman Cory Cunningham seconded. Motion passed 5-0.

Smokeys requested a special events permit for August 21st, which includes a band. Councilman Luke Henry moved to approve the special events permit for Smokey's on August 21st from 8-midnight. Councilman Dave Rogers seconded. Motion passed 5-0.

The 2022 budget was approved for publication.

Councilman Luke Henry moved to publish the 2022 budget. Councilman Cory Cunningham seconded. Motion passed 5-0

Mayor Lytle talked to Council about the Community Enhancement fund.

Councilman Chuck Rutledge moved to give the Library \$30,000 for their building fund and \$10,000 to the Historical Society. Councilman Luke Henry seconded. Motion passed 5-0.

City Superintendent Darien Kerr gave the Public Works activity report. Donna from KDOT called and stated the driveway at Select Steel driveway is a different elevation and DT Properties is asking for a 24 month warranty for the driveway and the State will not warranty it because it will be a city road.

Consensus was not to warranty the concrete.

Darien stated he has a meeting with Franklin # 1 on the 18th.

Councilman Chuck Rutledg moved to approve 2 new mixers for the sewer plant not to exceed \$30,000 the funds would come out of the Water-Sewer reserve fund. Councilman Cory Cunningham seconded. Motion passed 5-0

Chief Hackler gave the Police Department activity report. Danny stated he had a donation of office furniture for the police department.

Chief Hackler is working with Ring doorbell anyone who has ring doorbell could send video to the Police Department. They would also get some free equipment to give out to the public.

Chief Hackler is also working on the COPS grant which ends June of 2023. He has two candidates that he wants to interview.

Librarian Becky Dodd said they applied for an Arbor Grant for \$25,000 and received that award. The Friends of the Library also applied for a grant and received \$5000.00 for rock etc.

Councilman Luke Henry moved to adjourn the meeting. Councilman Cory Cunningham seconded. Motion passed 5-0.
