The regular meeting of the Wellsville City council was held on November 10, 2021 at 6:00 p.m. in the City Hall meeting room located at 411 Main Street. Councilmen present were Dave Rogers, Luke Henry, Chuck Rutledge and Cory Cunningham. Department heads present were City Superintendent Darien Kerr and Police Chief Danny Hackler.

Councilwoman Natalie Patton was absent.

The pledge of allegiance and invocation were given.

Councilman Dave Rogers moved to approve the consent agenda and the minutes of the previous meeting as presented. Councilman Luke Henry seconded. Motion passed 4-0.

Mayor Lytle opened the meeting up for public comments. There were no public comments.

County Commissioner Don Stottlemire gave the County report. The Sheriff announced that Rick Geist will be retiring after 8 years. The new under sheriff for Franklin County will be Kiel Lasswell.

Nichole Pruitt with Holidays in Wellsville spoke to council about possibly donating \$1500.00 for the Mayors Christmas tree. This is a pre-lit tree outdoor commercial tree the cost is \$6107.00. Nichole stated that the Mayors Christmas tree lighting will be November 30th at 5:45 p.m. at City Hall.

Councilman Cory Cunningham moved to donate \$2000.00 to the Holidays in Wellsville for the new tree. Councilman Chuck Rutledge seconded. Motion passed 4-0.

Trash cans for Main Street were discussed by the City Clerk and 2 options were given for council approval. As of now there are no trash cans at all on Main Street the old trash cans fell apart and had to be thrown away.

Councilman Dave Rogers moved to approve 6 trash cans from Global Industrial with a dome lid in the amount of \$617.00 per can. Not included in that cost would be shipping and handling fees the money would come out of the Community Enhancement fund. Councilman Luke Henry seconded. Motion passed 4-0.

City Superintendent Darien Kerr gave the public works activity report. Darien stated they had 2 water leaks over the weekend on 1061 Highway.

Police Chief Danny Hackler gave the police department activity report. Officer Davneport graduated the DARE program. DARE will start around spring break in the schools. There will be an assembly in the Middle School and the High School. Cram the

Cruiser will be Nov. 17th at the Dollar Store from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. Officers have joined Ottawa Police Department for no shave November. Each officer donated \$20.00 and those funds will be donated to an Ottawa Police Department family member battling cancer.

Chief Hackler provided a couple of images for the new graphics for the Police Cars beginning with the new vehicle that we purchased this year.

Councilman Luke Henry moved to spend \$850.00 for the new graphics for the new Police vehicle. Councilman Cory Cunningham seconded. Motion passed 4-0.

Chief Hackler stated that the WPD was awarded 7 De-Choker devices that were donated to the Police Department for each vehicle.

Councilman Chuck Rutledge moved to adjourn the meeting. Councilman Cory Cunningham seconded. Motion passed 4-0.
