County Commissioner Don Stottlemire gave the County activity report.

Shawn Anderson with Green Environmental talked to council about trash updates and cost. They purchased Ottawa Sanitation 5 years ago and gave the same pricing. It has come time to raise pricing. They stated that pricing will be going up and our contract is up July 1st and they feel a need to raise costs.

Council consensus was to go out for bid for trash service and recycling service.

City Superintendent Darien Kerr gave the Public Works activity report. Playground equipment has shown up and they are working on getting the area cleaned up and prepped for the new equipment. Darien said that Logan Tate turned in his resignation.

Police Chief Danny Hackler gave the police department activity report. Chief said two officers responded to an accident involving a motorcycle and they fled and hit one of our police cars.

Building official Isaac Mallory gave the Building and codes report. Isaac gave the council a final invoice to council regarding the invoice. Pyramid was driving on our concrete pad and tore it up by the Police Department. The agreement was they were to replace what was damaged and it is not being held up on their end. Isaac suggested

giving the company the striping money that was due. Consensus was to have a face to face meeting with all parties involved and to not release any money yet.
